LEGO ROBOTICS

This class will build teamwork skills through hands-on exploration and discovery using Lego Mindstorms. It incorporates a blend of software and hardware, computers and construction. Students use the computer to program the robots that they create and build. Students master the steps to engineer and build their model Lego robots, program them using the Lego Mindstorms software and evaluate their robot's behavior through various inputs and outputs (motors, tough sensors, light sensors, motion sensors and sound sensors).
