- Save on gas, parking, and rideshare costs
- Access destinations without needing to walk or drive.
- Reduce carbon emissions
- Make "first-mile" and "last-mile" connections for bus and train trips.
- Climb hills and keep up with traffic without getting sweaty.
- Help people with limitations due to age, physical fitness levels, or disabilities.



- Must ride in the same direction as traffic and obey all traffic lights,
- Are advised to wear helmets to minimize potential head injury. signs, and signals. Helmets are required in NJ for youth under age 17.
- Must park devices without blocking pedestrian and/or wheelchair
- Should not ride on sidewalks. Off-road trails generally do not allow ordinances and policies. Ride slowly in areas with pedestrians motorized bicycles, but may allow e-bikes and e-scooters. Regulations vary by municipality and county. Check all loca
