CALL TO ORDER

The Special Meeting of the Lacey Township Board of Education was held on June 4, 2025 in the Lacey Township High School Lecture Hall. The meeting was called to order by Board President Kim Klaus at 5:30 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mrs. Klaus led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

STATEMENT OF ADEQUATE NOTICE

Adequate Notice of this meeting was advertised in the Asbury Park on June 2, 2025, and by posting notice on the district website and in the Forked River Post Office and the Lanoka Harbor Post Office, and by filing a copy of the notice with the Lacey Township Clerk as required by the Open Public Meeting Act.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

Mr. William W. Zylinski, Acting Superintendent, presented the amended final budget for the 2025-2026 school year. The amended final budget shows a tax levy increase of 9.58%, cuts to teachers and several support staff, no salary raises, and no new curriculum or bus replacements. Mr. Zylinski further explained the changes from tentative to final. Mr. Zylinski spoke of the elimination of the redistricting which is allowing for the teacher positions to not be reduced as well as the additional tuition and security services that were changed. Mr. Zylinski also explained the elimination of the fund balance usage and the addition of the land sale.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Public comments highlighted differing opinions about the district's proposed budget cuts. Parents and teachers expressed concerns about increased class sizes, staff reductions, special education services, and student well-being, as well as the negative effects of tax hikes on the community. Comment regarding academic performance and the community's struggles. Conversely, public comment highlighted the district's successes in academic competitions, particularly in math, countering criticisms of the district's performance. Overall, many speakers called for empathy, understanding, and a balanced approach to budget decisions, urging the board to prioritize the long-term well-being of students and the financial health of the community.

SUPERINTENDENT COMMENT

Mr. Zylinski, Acting Superintendent, thanked the community for their comments. Mr. Zylinski stressed that delays cause uncertainty and that without the budget, the district faces deeper cuts, and possible state intervention. Mr. Zylinski thanked the township committee for their support and called for the community to unite in solving the financial challenges.

BOARD COMMENT

Board members expressed strong opinions in favor and opposition to the proposed budget and tax increases. Opposition to the banding of elementary schools, citing negative impacts on families, opposition to the tax hikes, and affect on the community as a whole. Support in favor of the proposed budget citing passing the budget would bring stability and continued support education for all students.

9. <u>ADOPTION OF THE 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR BUDGET</u>

MOTION: Move that the Board adopt the final budget for the 2025-2026 school year as follows:

WHEREAS, the Lacey Township Board of Education adopted a tentative budget on May 1, 2025, and submitted it to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools for approval, and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget was approved by the Executive County Superintendent of Schools on May 8, 2025, and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget was advertised on the district website on May 8, 2025 and in the legal section of the Asbury Park Press on May 13, 2025, and

WHEREAS, in the proposed FY2026 State Budget, certain districts had the opportunity to apply to the Commission of Education to increase expenditures, including an allocation of Tax Levy Incentive Aid, in order to satisfy the thoroughness and efficiency standards established pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-46, and

WHEREAS, based on the information provided by the New Jersey Department of Education, Lacey Township is below local fair share and spending below adequacy to be eligible to participate in this program, and

WHEREAS, Lacey Township is eligible to increase expenditures by up to \$17,541,395 and qualify for Tax Levy Incentive Aid in the amount of up to \$877,070, and

WHEREAS, Lacey Township requested to increase expenditures by \$4,127,051(inclusive of TLIA) and qualify for Tax Levy Incentive Aid in the amount of \$196,526 pending NJDOE approval, and WHEREAS, the final budget was presented to the public during a hearing held in the Lacey Township High School, Lanoka Harbor, NJ, on May 15, 2025 and further presented to the Board for adoption on June 4, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has now determined to make modifications to the tentative budget as follows:

Travel and Related Expense Reimbursement

WHEREAS, the Lacey Township Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3 et seq. requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Lacey Township Board of Education established \$92,350 as the maximum travel amount for the current school year and has expended \$49,247 as of this date; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3, to a maximum expenditure of \$57,050 for all staff and board members for the 2025-2026 school year.

Adjustment to Health Care Costs

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lacey Township Board of Education includes in the final budget the adjustment for increased costs of health benefits in the amount of \$1,428,884. The additional funds will be used to pay for the additional increases in health benefit premiums.

Use of Banked Cap

BE IT RESOLVED that the Lacey Township Board of Education includes in the proposed budget the adjustment for banked cap in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-10.1(b). The district has fully exhausted all eligible statutory spending authority and must increase the base budget in the amount of \$104,051 for the purpose of maintaining 1 teacher. The district intends to complete said purposes by June 2026.

Authorization to Implement the 2025-2026 Budget

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lacey Township School District Board of Education authorize the

Superintendent and Business Administrator/Board Secretary to implement the 2025-2026 budget pursuant to local and state policies.

A4F - Tax Levy Certification Forms A and B

BE IT RESOLVED, that the amount required for school purposes in the school district of Lacey Township, County of Ocean for the 2025-2026 school year is \$67,061,524 and is required to be levied for local school district purposes.
